

# Volunteer Opportunity for a Registered New Zealand Secondary School Teacher Pyongyang, North Korea

Three Months, July to September 2011.

The NZ DPRK Society is looking for a qualified teacher to spend three months (July – September) teaching English classes at the Kumsong School and Kumsong Middle School No.1 in Pyongyang, the capital Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK), more commonly known as North Korea.

Kumsong School opened in 1966 with 150 pupils. It now has primary, middle and special courses for over 2000 students. There are over 400 teaching staff and special-course rooms for art education, modern computer rooms and various laboratories, a lecture hall, a gymnasium, dormitories for students and a medical clinic.

Kumsong Middle School No. 1 provides middle school education to train talented students. Each day there are 4-6 classes of 45 minutes classes. There are about 600 students aged between 11 and 17.

The volunteer teacher will confer with the school authorities on arrival and define with them the structure of the course he or she will teach and then plan and teach accordingly.

All expenses will be met either by the NZ DPRK Society or the Kumsong schools. Apart from a small discretionary budget, no other salary or allowances will be paid.
